
Intermediate Core Bond

Fund Overview: The Fund seeks total return with an emphasis on income. All Fund holdings are guided by The Calvert Principles for Responsible Investment (Calvert Principles).

Research Process: Investment decisions for the Fund are made primarily on the basis of fundamental and quantitative research conducted by the investment adviser's research staff and consideration of responsible investment criteria. Fund management conducts deep, proprietary research across approximately 200 peer groups using over 200 key performance indicators (KPIs) to measure material environmental, social and governance (ESG) factors.

Calvert Leadership: Calvert Research and Management is a recognized leader in Responsible Investing, offering investment strategies that seek superior long-term performance and positive global impact. The Calvert Principles provide a framework for the evaluation of ESG factors and guide our active engagement efforts with company management.





DEFINITIONS: Average effective maturity is the weighted average of the maturities of the underlying bonds accounting for any bonds that are callable. **Effective duration** measures a portfolio's sensitivity to changes in interest rates when a portfolio contains bonds with features such as puts and calls. Generally, the longer the effective duration, the greater the price change relative to interest-rate movements. **Number of holdings** provided are a typical range, not a maximum number. The portfolio may exceed this from time to time due to market conditions and outstanding trades. **SEC yield** is a measure of the income generated by the portfolio's underlying asset over the trailing 30 days, relative to the asset base of the portfolio itself. Ratings: The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and openended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. Ratings do not take into account sales loads.

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OTHER CONSIDERATIONS: The Fund may invest in a fixed or floating-rate income security before the Adviser has completed its evaluation of the security's responsible investment characteristics if, in the opinion of the portfolio managers, the timing of the purchase is appropriate given market conditions. The Fund may also invest in cash, money market instruments and exchange-traded funds which will generally not be subject to responsible investment analysis.

Portfolio characteristics exclude 1 security in Calvert's High Impact Investments program, which represented 0.117% of the portfolio as of 12/31/2024. High Social Impact Investments are investments that, in the Adviser's opinion, offer the opportunity for significant sustainability and social impact.
