

Eaton Vance Global Macro Absolute Return Advantage Fund

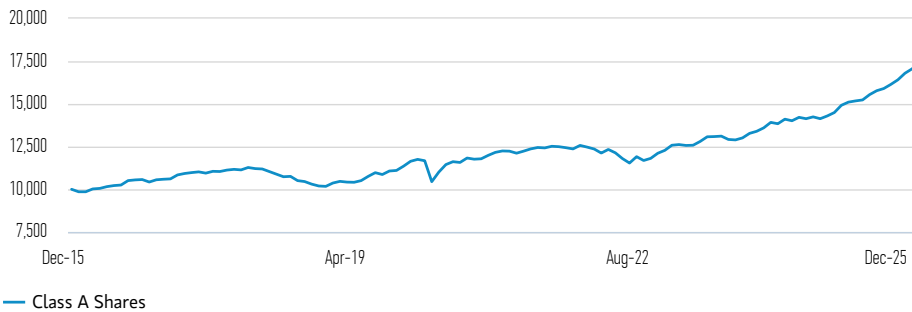
A flexible global absolute return strategy designed to complement traditional asset classes.

The Fund: Unconstrained to a traditional benchmark, Fund managers scour the globe in search of investment opportunities both long and short. Implements a flexible approach to investing across the emerging and developed markets, providing global exposure that may help counterbalance performance swings in conventional holdings.

The Approach: Eaton Vance applies its global macroeconomic and political research process in directing Fund investments. This time-tested process informs long and short positions in sovereign asset classes, such as foreign currencies and sovereign credit markets. Managers consider relative risk and return in managing exposures.

The Features: A flexible mandate translates into investment opportunities in both improving and deteriorating markets. Potential for low volatility and managed with an eye toward risk-adjusted returns. Expected low beta may help the Fund complement traditional holdings. Managed by Eaton Vance, a global investing leader.

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DEFINITIONS: SEC yield is a measure of the income generated by the portfolio's underlying asset over the trailing 30 days, relative to the asset base of the portfolio itself. The **SEC 30-day yield subsidized** reflects current fee waivers in effect. Absent such fee waivers, the yield would have been lower. The **SEC 30-day yield unsubsidized** does not reflect the fee waivers currently in effect.

INDEX INFORMATION: The **ICE BofA 3-Month US Treasury Bill Index** is an unmanaged index of US Treasury securities maturing in 90 days.

The Fund employs an "absolute return" investment approach, benchmarking itself to an index of cash instruments and seeking to achieve returns that are largely independent of broad movements in stocks and bonds. Ratings: The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and opened mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. Ratings do not take into account sales loads.
